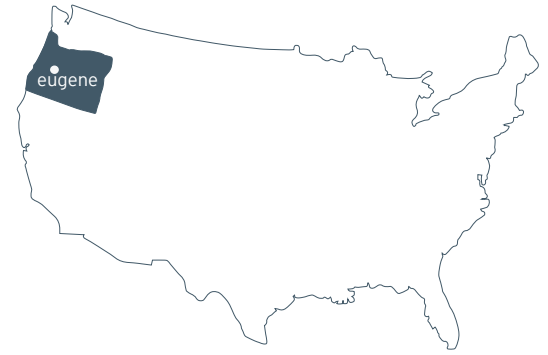

Existing Space

The purpose of this project was to provide two additional offices for the Geography Department office suite in Condon Hall. The design relocated the reception area closer to the entry door and better utilized the central area of the office.

In order to accomplish this, walls, doors and all interior finishes were demolished, and new interior walls were designed with relites that allow light to penetrate deep into the space. New cabinetry designed for the department's needs, doors, paint, ceilings and flooring were installed.



Space planning for new furniture systems and lighting were also incorporated into the project.



Interior Palettes

The materials palette, in addition to flooring, cabinet and trim samples incorporated several art pieces into the space; one is a laser-cut historical map of Oregon on an interior door and the others are three art glass panels that feature topographic details of the state. Laser cutting was done locally at Mac Industries, and the art glass was made by Annah James Studios.
