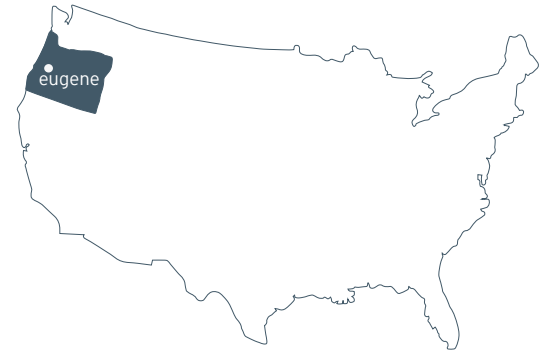

Existing Space

Bringing the family together in a seamless flow was the goal of this extensive kitchen remodel. The active young family wanted spaces that would allow togetherness without crowding each other. To accomplish this, the existing kitchen and family room were joined together into a seamless work, study and gathering space.



The Concept

2fORM developed several schemes to accomplish the owner's goals of spatial connections. New cabinetry was an integral part of the design, allowing the room to be accessible and open to the rest of the first floor.

By switching the location of the family room and the dining rooms, the family is able to gather in natural ways. The children do their homework at the island while dinner is being prepared, everyone helps with cooking.













Details

To keep the look uncluttered, large drawers and pantry cabinets are designed to hold all the cooking tools and food. A pantry is incorporated into the kitchen for storage of bulky items.

Custom cherry cabinets were made by locally, and Lumicor resin panels were incorporated into the sliding pantry doors to bring a feeling of light into that corner. The Lumicor panels with fine metal threads embedded in the resin were also used in the upper cabinets on the window wall. All the appliances were replaced.







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
